6. New Business

- a. New Volunteer Coordinator introduced Trish Ay.
- b. Finn's Friends and Buddy Bench Group of intermediate students that were part of Finn's Friends in past who wore blue vests at recess to play with students that don't have someone to play with. Not currently

running this year. Brenda Kirsch spoke about how Finn's Friends went down hill last year and was a safety issue. Volunteers have to monitor it. Supervisors too busy. Buddy bench is not known to students. Similar idea that if child doesn't have someone to play with they sit on the buddy bench and someone comes to play with them. Possibly paint it to make it known. Brenda agreed to discuss the buddy bench further and possibly a student council initiative.

### c. Other new business

- i. Salvation Army Need Salvation Army Holiday Coordinator to work with Tracey Beckett as a liaison between PAC and Salvation Army. Usually sponsor 10 families. Families shop all donated gifts at Salvation Army warehouse. Save on Foods gift cards sold to support Salvation Army. Raised about \$400 from GC sales in past. Field trip to Salvation Army in past. Grade 4/5 community working with Salvation Army as part of year projects. Bell at Christmas concert for donations. Gifting tree option. GC's at Christmas and possibly spring. Patty Glover to look into Save on Cards all year.
- ii. Student council CLE will launch a new Student Council this November . Open to two students from each learning community (grades), students will meet monthly (mentored and supervised by CLE Admin, teachers and PAC member Richard Deacon).
- iii. Possible TBones GC fundraiser discussed. Same idea as Save on Foods GC.
- iv. Purdy's Chocolates already raised \$500. November 28 deadline to order. Patty G to contact Julie re: pamphlets for ordering.

### 7. Finance Report

- a. Discussion of 2018/2019 Budget
  - i. Gaming Grant is up to \$11,400.
  - ii. Save on Foods gift cards not included yet. Family Dance might not happen without Coordinator. Possibly Sock fundraiser revenue - Richard to look further into school spirit wear for early 2019 along with a fitness fundraiser. URstore discussed -Vancouver company - small amount of return - Richard to look into.

- iii. Total projected revenue \$39,800, Total projected expenses \$42,775, Projected deficit of \$2,975. Adequate retained in bank account to cover deficit.
- iv. \$30-40K must be retained in bank constantly for hot lunch payments. At September 1, 2018, there was \$63,619 in all bank accounts. Discussion on whether we could use some of this money for extras. Discussion regarding more for the teachers throughout the year. Not just teacher appreciation lunch. Order extra muffins/scones from Sunshine on hot lunch days. Extra coffee on coffee mornings. Christmas gift cards for custodial staff \$50 each. Bump up to \$1000. Discussion on whether we can use extra money for projector system or other extras from school wish list.
- v. Budget changes to be posted and voted on at next meeting.

# 8. Committee Reports

- a. Hot Lunch Great team this year. New Vendors Chopped Leaf temperature was not acceptable. Profit margins are low on some vendors. The higher the cost of the item, the fewer orders and low margins raised. Hot lunch increases by only \$.50 at most to cost of items for profit margin. Still considering new vendors and vendors which don't make much money.
