- 6. Finance Report
 - a. 2018/2019 current year to date financial report available for review. A copy will be posted on the PAC bulletin board and on the website at www.clesharks.ca. No red flags on comparison to budget. Nothing to discuss.

b. 2018/2019 Budget discussion

- i. Richard Deacon spoke about the student council and how it works. Four students presented to the PAC Breanna, Cadence, Mei-viz and Dom. Students have come up with 100 ideas on how to make our school a better place. Top ideas voted on and brought to PAC for discussion, however 1 idea presented for funding. Ideas included a school mascot, beyblade tournament, talent show and sandbox toys. The student council requested \$500 to buy sand toys for the sand pit. They would like the funding by April for spring enjoyment. Other items will be dealt with within the school and may not require any funding from PAC. Discussion on what the \$500 will be used for and asking the students to research what they want to purchase.
 - a. The PAC discussed the idea that the Student Council receive \$500 at the start of the year to be used at their discretion. PAC members present voted unanimously to provide \$500 a year for the student council.

a. Internet Safety Policy - A case came up at school and was brought to PACs attention. Discussion was held between PAC and school admin. Patty Glover has discussed with School division. District meeting will be held after March break to review the policy in the district. The school division representative will get back to Patty regarding what is discussed at a school division level. April or May PAC meeting hopefully will have further information for parents.

10. Q&A From Parents

a. Tannis McCarthy asked about an update about budget requests at last months meeting. The Imagination Playground blocks that Mr. Sadlowski wants would need a shipper and flatbed arranged by school. 55 block set would be sent by Fedex. Sample block is being sent. Company to send list of Canadian Principals that have the blocks in the school for references on how they are used and curriculum use. Storage solutions from the company include carts on wheels (we would need 3 of them). They can all be shipped by Fedex. \$200 per cart. Tabled until next meeting. Amount will be far less than \$6,000 requested. They

- suggested 55 block set and smaller set with smaller blocks that can be used with 55 block set.
- b. Budget request for up to \$10,000 from staff The PAC has not spent the full \$10,000 yet, however some ideas are still being discussed (blocks). Tabled until future meeting.
